Chapter 66

FIREARMS

[HISTORY: Adopted by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Saddle Rock 6-4-1952 by Ord. No. 10. Amendments noted where applicable.]

§ 66-1. Permit required.

- A. It shall be unlawful for any firm, corporation, company or person to keep, store, transport or have in its possession any high or low explosives, fuse or electric blasting caps, fireworks of any description or any other explosive compound or other dangerous articles without first obtaining a permit from the Board of Trustees of the Village of Saddle Rock.
- B. No person, firm or corporation shall keep, store, sell, expose for sale or give away any loaded cartridges, blank cartridges, caps, percussion caps, fuses or electric blasting caps, dynamite, firecrackers or other fireworks or any other explosive materials of any description without first obtaining a permit from the Board of Trustees of the Village of Saddle Rock.
- C. No person shall discharge any air rifles, BB guns, firearms, rockets, gunpowder, firecrackers, torpedoes, blasting caps, dynamite or other explosives within the Village of Saddle Rock without first obtaining a permit from the Board of Trustees of the Village of Saddle Rock, except that persons having duly issued licenses or permits of competent authority to carry or possess concealed weapons shall not be required to first obtain the permit hereinbefore mentioned in this subsection before using such firearms so permitted within the intent of such license or permit.

§ 66-2. Issuance of permit.

No permit shall be issued without first obtaining the approval of the Bureau of Public Safety of the Nassau County Police Department in writing. This approval is to be attached to the application before being acted upon.

§ 66-3. Penalties for offenses. ¹ [Amended 12-2-1987 by L.L. No. 5-1987]

- A. Any person violating the provisions of this chapter or any part thereof shall be guilty of a violation. Each day, or part thereof, upon which any such violation shall occur shall be a separate violation.
- B. The officers, directors, agents and managers of any corporation violating this chapter shall, in addition to the corporation, be subject to the penalties of Subsection A hereof.
